Measuring What Matters: Building Trust and Legitimacy

VCPI began development of this online resource for law enforcement agencies nationwide focusing on the reduction of violent crime, organizational culture, officer safety and wellness, and measuring and sustaining success.



NTTAC BJA National Training and Technical Assistance (BJA NTTAC)

Through this program, VCPI provides crime prevention training to agencies requesting services. Additionally, VCPI is also now an NTTAC Provider for BJA's new Prosecution Assessment TTA Program.



NASRO New Curriculum for the National Association of **School Resource Officers**

VCPI began development of an introductory-level School Resource Officer eLearning course.

© COPS Contemporary Community Policing: a National Law **Enforcement Training Initiative (CCP)**


VCPI launched this initiative supporting the advancement of community policing nationwide through an instructor development program.




© COPS Contemporary Approach to Reimagining Effective **Broken Windows Theory (CARE BWT)**
