#### WE ARE A FORCE MULTIPLIER

For 25 years, we've focused on maximizing the impact of the funding we've received by developing and delivering training and services that make a difference. Over the years, NCPI has received more than \$60 million in federal and state awards; contracts with non-profits organizations, universities, local law enforcement agencies, and others; and donations, to provide public safety training and services across the country.

### IN THE FY2022-2023 ALONE. NCPI RECEIVED OVER **\$4 MILLION IN REVENUE** THAT SUPPORTED:

- Developing original content for 16 new training programs and resourčės, including more than **100** multi-media segments
- Training more than **24,000** public safety participants nationwide, representing more than **3,500** agencies

- Adding 5 new talented staff members to expand our team and capacity
- Providing more than **500,000** notifications to victims on changes to offender custody status
- Expanding our support of other mission-driven organizations such as CNA, CIT International, NHTSA, NPI, PERF, NASRO, NDEC, UT LEIC and other learning partners

- Launching a national messaging campaign. to encourage community engagement in violent crime reduction efforts

#### **VIRGINIA SHERIFFS' INSTITUTE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM**

This program promotes, recognizes and elevates the continued individual professional development of Virginia's sheriffs and deputies. In the spring of 2023, 28 new Virginia sheriff's office personnel earned their VSIC credential and 15 earned their recertification.





#### VIOLENT CRIME REDUCTION: INFORMATION, MESSAGING, & ENGAGEMENT (VCRIME)

NCPI launched MyVoice.OurCommunity., a national messaging campaign encouraging a sense of shared responsibility in the community toward violent crime reduction. NCPI captured a Knoxville, TN pilot implementation of MyVoice.OurCommunity. in a video documentary, available (with other resources) on MyVoice.OurCommunity.org.



#### **VIRGINIA VICTIM INFORMATION AND NOTIFICATION EVERYDAY**

Since its launch, VA VINE has provided critical information about inmate custody status, connected survivors with resources in their communities, and will soon add a protective order notification enhancement. In this FY, nearly 3 million searches were conducted in VA VINE, with more than 500,000 custody notifications sent to survivors across the Commonwealth



#### VEHICULAR PURSUIT MANAGEMENT: BALANCING RISKS AND ENHANCING SAFETY

NCPI began developing a web-based course for the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF) on police pursuits.





#### ENHANCING BEHAVIORAL THREAT ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT TRAINING WITH ALL-INCLUSIVE AWARENESS AND DATA

NCPI began developing a web-based course on improving police encounters with community members with autism spectrum disorder as part of a BJA award with the National Policing Institute.

#### **CONTEMPORARY COMMUNITY POLICING**

NCPI completed the delivery of this successful national Instructor Development Initiative, training more than 150 instructors from 100 agencies in 28 states. Originally designed for in-person delivery, the program evolved during the pandemic into a new hybrid course.

# CONTEMPORARY APPROACHES FOR RESPONDING EFFECTIVELY TO COMMUNITY-DEFINED DISORDER (CARE CDD)

NCPI launched two eLearning courses highlighting innovative practices and emphasizing the collaborative role of police and other public safety partners as caretakers of their communities – training more than 500 practitioners representing 250 agencies nationwide.

## NATIONAL EXPANSION OF THE MANAGING BIAS TRAINING PROGRAM: ENCOURAGING LAW ENFORCEMENT TO UNDERSTAND TOLERANCE

NCPI began developing a comprehensive program specifically designed for law enforcement to help teach, reinforce, and apply strategies for managing bias. It will include a core curriculum, instructor development and web-based training components.

NCPI built, administers, manages, promotes, and supports the *COPS Training Portal*, a web-based resource providing the nation's law enforcement with on-demand training and resources. This year, NCPI increased registrations to 37,958 individuals representing 7,506 agencies, addressing dozens of contemporary training topics, including 7 new courses.



#### NHTSA INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY (I/DD) ONLINE TRAINING

NCPI developed Better Encounters: Police and People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, a web-based course developed for NHTSA to help law enforcement employ strategies for positive interactions during traffic-related encounters with people who have I/DD.



NCPI developed and delivered two National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) web-based courses, training over 3,500 officers from more than 1,200 agencies in Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement Refresher and Expert Insights: Testifying in Court as a Drug Recognition Expert.



## CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAMS ADAPTIVE SYSTEM OF SUPPORTS FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND SPECIALIZED TRAINING (CIT ASSIST) INITIATIVE

As the COPS Office's National CIT TTA Provider, NCPI developed three web-based CIT courses and an interactive eGuide (available 2023 and 2024), launched the CIT ASSIST Community of Practice Online Resource Center, supporting COPS-funded agencies engaged in mental health crisis response initiatives in their communities. These agencies participated in 9 virtual and in-person events on critical topics.
